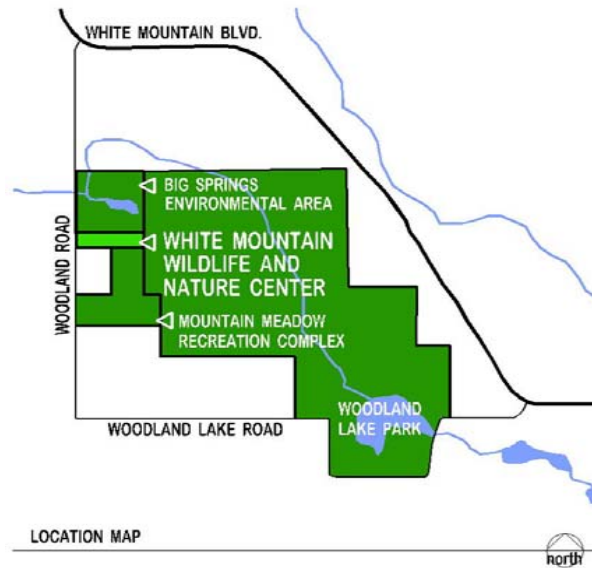

Woodland Lake into which osprey frequently plunge to catch fish for nesting young.

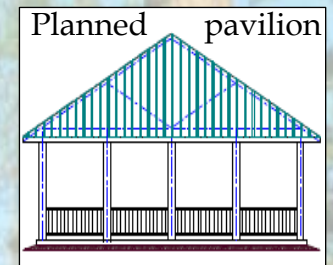
Our GOALS are to:
